Course Description

Semester 1 Book: *Wonder* — We will read about 2-4 chapters per week. If we are running behind, reading will be assigned for homework. We will discuss the chapters in class and in breakout rooms. Students will be assigned a Guided Chapter Summary for homework, along with projects along the way. All homework will be posted in Google Classroom.

Semester 2 Book: *Awkward* and *Brave* **(2 books)** – We will read about 2-4 chapters per week. If we are running behind, reading will be assigned for homework. We will discuss the chapters in class and in breakout rooms. Students will be assigned a Guided Chapter Summary for homework, along with projects along the way. All homework will be posted in Google Classroom.

Vocabulary: We will review vocabulary words from the story, their meanings and how to use them correctly in sentences.

Grammar Skills: Students will learn about: sentence structure; kinds of sentences; punctuation; parts of speech; subject and predicate agreement; using quotes; and how to use commas.

Writing: Students will do Quick Writes in class: They will be given a topic and they write on it for 10 minutes; then we look for grammar mistakes, misspelled words and share in class or with a partner. Students will write a final paper going through the Writing Process: prewriting, drafting, revising, and editing.

Projects: Self-Portrait with your own precept; Mr. Browne's Precepts booklet; create as storyboard

Final Project: Students will an essay on kindness.

Class Format: Quick Write, edit & share; read; discuss reading, in prep for Guided Chapter Summary homework; Grammar Skills (not every class); go over homework or project or writing assignment.
