### **Course Description**

Welcome to Leadership. This is not a class that will happen around you. Instead, you will be expected to learn actively and use the information when formulating your own opinions and personal views about leadership. These views will vary from classmate to classmate, as each of you determine the type of leader you wish to become. We will use a variety of resources, but much of our work will come from:

- The 7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens, by Stephen Covey
- Think Again, by Adam Grant
- Pyramid of Success, John Wooden's

Our theme this year is Feeling Connected.

Grades will be point based with a scoring rubric provided at the time of the assignment. Classroom participation is necessary, and 10 points will be given each day class meets.

### **Method of Instruction**

The primary method of instruction will be "student centered," through class discussions, cooperative group work, speeches, and teacher/student interaction. Lectures will be used occasionally to provide needed information. Your ideas, shared discussions, and personal responses will be needed. Plan to keep up with outside assignments, finish your share of group assignments, and be prepared to make regular contributions to class. Homework and outside reading will be graded.



## Citizenship

Citizenship reflects a student's conduct and attitude throughout the course. All students should be on time for class, cameras turned on, and have all needed materials. Students need to come to class genuinely engaged in each class lesson, be willing to listen carefully to others, express their own ideas and views, ask pertinent questions and perform tasks asked by classmates and the teacher.
